What you will do

You will spend an enjoyable day amongst modellers, starting with a demonstration on modelling techniques. You will then be encouraged to have a go on your own models. This may entail working on your rolling stock but if you want to bring something else to do then you will be at liberty to tackle any project that can be done on a kitchen table.

You will learn easy ways to mix paint to produce the desired finish, what to do if things go wrong, and alternative ways to replace and improve couplings.

Your Host (Andy Stevens)

I have been a volunteer on the South Devon Railway for 15 years, and now work on the line full-time in my role as Finance Manager. I have 40 years experience as your "average modeller" and use simple methods that are easy to follow. I do not use airbrushes although I have dabbled with aerosol sprays and weathering powders.

I was the Exhibition Manager for the memorable Rail I 50 and Festival of Transport 2000 events that were held at Newton Abbot Racecourse. These were both very successful; 4,000 visitors came to the first weekend and I 3,000 arrived for the Festival! Iain Rice kindly obtained an excellent selection of layouts that graced both shows.

I was a Director of the Model Railway Heritage Trust during its existence until the untimely passing of one of our founders, Martin Brent, precipitated its demise. I picked up many good tips from my friends in the Trust, but I have no special talent and I am sure that my results can be obtained by anyone with a bit of patience and guidance.

The Restoration Project

6412 is a former GWR Pannier Tank that is currently in an advanced state of restoration at our workshops in Buckfastleigh. Progress has been rapid in recent months and the loco is on target to re-enter service in 2012, after a major (and very expensive) project to bring her back to life. She will be a vital addition to our fleet and fitted for auto-train working, a feature which was synonymous with the Ashburton

Branch prior to closure in 1958. The South Devon Railway is a forerunner in running authentic auto-trains, and many of us have a soft spot for 6412 and are delighted to see her return to the railway. Her restoration is progressing well but funds are urgently needed to finish the job. Every penny that is paid to join the skills day will be put into the restoration fund so your contribution will be going to a very worthy cause.
